were confident that her contribution to the school would be in teaching our beginner and intermediate riders. And of course she did that beautifully. What was always lovely to watch, though, was when someone with a bit more experience got on her. It was then that she could show everyone what she had been capable of in her younger years. (At those moments we'd regret that we didn't get the opportunity to bring her to Harrogate earlier!)

Bella dutifully took on the task of teaching her students and while she was never unfair or dirty about it, she was just cheeky enough to keep her intermediate and beginner riders on their toes.

She injured a ligament in her foot this fall and was on a six months leave of absence in the hopes that the injury would heal and she could return to work. Her future with us was secure regardless of her recovery as she had definitively earned her retirement.

Making a decision to let a horse go is one of the hardest things I ever have to do. While still not easy, sometimes, when an injury or illness is catastrophic, the decision is made for us.

On Tuesday evening we realized that Bella was clearly in trouble with a neurological event that had affected her hind legs. By the next morning, despite the drugs we had given her, she still seemed very fragile. By the afternoon, her hind legs had weakened to the point where if she had laid down, she would not have been able to get back up. The decision had been made for us.

She was blessed by the fact that she did not seem to be in any discomfort at all. If ever a horse deserved to pass away with no pain and a mouth full of grain, it was Bella.

She had some hard miles on her over the years and we're so thankful she got to share her twilight years with us at Harrogate.

She will be missed. RIP Bella and thank you.


